Jo welcomed everybody to the meeting and informed those present that today CAMRA's chief executive Tim Page announced that he would be leaving the Campaign to return to working in the charitable sector until his retirement. ### PUB UPDATES

- **Wheel Alehouse:** Alan is in negotiations regarding the sale of the business.
- **Great Tree:** Closing as a pub and being opened as a café.
- **Artillery Arms:** Has been sold to a property developer.

### BREWERIES & PUB CHAINS

- **By the Mile:** Jon was absent and had not sent a report in advance.
- **Four Candles:** Dennis reported that business as usual at the Candles. Stig and Mike are still producing the same excellent quality of beer that we came to expect under Paul. Recently announced a beer festival to take place on weekend 7/8<sup>th</sup> July at the Sarah Thorne Theatre.
- **Isla Vale:** Still amassing ingredients to get up to capacity for full production. No new beers planned.
- **Margate:** Different parts are almost complete – later this year possibly for production.
- **NauticAles:** Their flagship ale Maiden Voyage is becoming increasingly popular; several festivals around the country have ordered it and feedback has been excellent. Micky Rush is looking for premises in Thanet to start his own brewing operation, these premises need to accommodate grain, hop and cask storage and offices. Once Micky has located premises he would be willing, if there is interest, to partake in a fly on the wall series for AoT following his progress to brew first ale.
- **Northdown:** Plumbed in and getting ready to start production.
- **Ramsgate:** In Martin's absence the secretary presented his report: Gadds' No 3 won Kent Beer of the Year at the Taste of Kent Awards. Summers Day (Light Kentish Ale at 4.3%) and Festive Ale (Hoppy Pale Ale at 3.8%) are currently in production. No. 11: A low alcohol full flavour pale ale 1.1% is to be launched during the summer (postponed from early May), finer detail being put in place and launch will be at the brewery when everything is ready. One of the breweries regulars, Seaside, will soon be available in cans. The successful brewery tours continue at the beginning of each month, on rare occasions when places become available I will be informed and local CAMRA members will be offered a place on a first come first served basis. As this will be at very short notice the information will be released via Thanet CAMRA social media.
- **Wantsum:** Had a successful beer festival and will run more. Their tours are also going well. They will be part of the green hop festival in early October with several other

breweries. Plenty of cask and key keg ales being produced, a large range of guest ales are also now being supplied.
